

AN INTRODUCTION

Recognized internationally as a premier example of town planning, Mariemont is characterized by tree-lined streets, beautifully cared-for homes, outstanding village services and facilities, and a unique sense of community. Residents of all ages appreciate the convenience Mariemont provides: businesses on the Square, the municipal pool, tennis courts, schools, parks and ball fields can all be reached on foot or by bicycle. Mariemont homes vary in style and size to include Cape Cods, Tudors, cottage bungalows, pillared colonials and stately traditionals. The Village is ably served by full-time police and fire departments, as well as a mayor and council selected through a Town Meeting process. The award-winning Mariemont School District enhances the enduring appeal of the Village and strengthens every home investment.

MARY EMERY'S DREAM

Prior to World War I and at the direction of businesswoman and philanthropist Mary Emery, town planner John Nolen initiated studies regarding the planned village which was eventually to become Mariemont. In addition, many of the finest architects in the country—from Cincinnati, Boston, New York and Philadelphia—were engaged to design separate but harmonious homes, group-houses and public buildings. The resulting variety reflected the basic goal of this planned community: to serve the needs of people from all walks of life. Ground-breaking did not occur until 1923, and in 1926 construction of its first structure, the Memorial Church, was completed. Of English Norman design and often dubbed "the architectural gemstone of the Village," the church is crowned by a stone roof that was brought from England, where it originally sheltered a 14th-century tithe barn. In 1941, the Village was incorporated to avoid annexation to the city of Cincinnati and preserve its singular identity and appeal.
